INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS IN THE ROMANIAN NAVAL ACADEMY

The internationalization process of the Romanian Naval Academy "Mircea cel Bătrân" in the last decades has been focused on increasing the academic visibility and its impact at regional, European, and international levels. This has been achieved by continuously and adaptively leveraging opportunities for the development and diversification of educational and training offerings, as well as scientific research, innovation, and institutional development programs, in a competitive, intercultural, and multinational environment. In the complex contemporary context, the strategic development vision at the international level has systematically aimed at defining the Romanian Naval Academy as a hub for scientific research and a key provider of educational services in the naval and maritime fields, both military and civilian, in the Black Sea region and at European level, by fostering academic quality and excellence. To support these internationalization policies and strategies, the Romanian Naval Academy has systematically sought to maximize the funding potential for institutional projects and programs from structural, community, regional, or international funds.

The Romanian Naval Academy's vision for enhancing the quality of education, training and scientific research processes on international scale has been grounded in the visionary goals set by the European Commission's 2030 Strategy, which defines the European Education and Research Area and its development imperatives harmonized at the EU level. In this regard, the Naval Academy has pursued the expansion and diversification of its collaboration portfolio with external partners by promoting its educational and training offer in widely spoken international languages and by taking part in various European and international academic or military education and training programs or in the implementation of a wide set of strategic partnership projects. These efforts have continuously strengthened both by the institutional bilateral relations and by the students' and faculty/staff/specialists' mobilities and placements, incoming and outgoing.

The internationalization process at the Romanian Naval Academy "Mircea cel Bătrân" has been developed and implemented based on widely recognized academic principles, ensuring institutional transparency, ethics and equity, diversification, embedded by a strong commitment for excellence. The internationalization vision embraced also the Euro-Atlantic principles for integrating national and universal cultural values through various strategic action directions, summarized as follows:

- * Encouraging regional and international cooperation and increasing global visibility by expanding the network of academic and economic partners, as well as by actively participating as member in various international organizations, forums, or associations;
- * Diversifying international mobility opportunities for students (i.e. incoming and outgoing exchanges for studies, internships, and training) and for faculty/instructors/experts (i.e. incoming and outgoing exchanges for teaching and training);
- * Developing international academic or military training programs in cooperation with European and international military partner institutions;
- * Leveraging research and development potential through the implementation of joint actions/projects/programs with international partners, funded by community, regional, or international funds.

→ regarding the enhancement of regional and international cooperation, the Romanian Naval Academy "Mircea cel Bătrân" has established bilateral cooperation partnerships in the fields of education, training, and scientific research with over 50 similar universities from both the military and civilian areas and with over 60 companies in maritime professional field providing an extensive portfolio for cadetship for civilian merchant marine students. These partnerships span across the European Union, the Balkans, Southeast Asia, and North America.

Beyond these inter-institutional agreements, the Naval Academy has expanded its cooperation imperative by integrating as an active member in relevant regional and international organizations, associations, and forums within the maritime and naval academic field (IAMU – International Association of Maritime Universities, BSAMI – Black Sea Association of Maritime Institutions), as well as in military education and training (ENASC – European Naval Academies' Superintendents Conference, iMAF – International Military Academic Forum, EUMACS – European Union Military Academies Commandants' Seminar, EMILYO – European Initiative for the Exchange of Young Officers).

THE INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGES PROGRAM UNDER THE ERASMUS+ FRAMEWORK

By accessing the academic and professional networks, which encompasses over 100 universities and academies in the naval, maritime, or military fields, the Romanian Naval Academy has diversified and strengthened its cooperative relationships with a significant number of European partners, while simultaneously engaging with a wide range of international partners across all continents. In the last years, international relations have yielded positive effects with substantial added value, reflected in the harmonization of academic practices in education, training, and research in compliance with the international standards. Additionally, they have been further enhanced through the successful acquisition of funding for regional and international projects and programs. This has served as a key driver in promoting the image of both the Romanian Naval Academy and the Romanian Naval Forces on a global scale.

Regarding *international academic mobility under the Erasmus+ program*, the Romanian Naval Academy has continuously expanded and diversified its range of mobility opportunities in recent years, offering placements for students (studies, internships, and training) as well as for faculty, instructors, and experts (teaching and training). During the past years, under the Erasmus+ program, the Naval Academy ranked as the top university in the Southeastern region of Romania in terms of total funding accessed for mobility programs and among the top institutions on national level in terms of funding allocated per student.

Currently, the Academy has bilateral institutional partnerships with universities from Europe (e.g. Bulgaria, Poland, Italy, France, Germany, Spain, Lithuania, Latvia, Greece, Norway, Finland, Turkey, Croatia, Slovenia, Portugal, Belgium) as well as from Erasmus+partner countries (e.g. Albania, Montenegro, Ukraine, Moldova, Georgia, the United States, and China).

As average numbers, the Academy counts a regular number of 90 outgoing students per year and 50 incoming students per year only for study placements, with an additional over 100 outgoing and incoming cadets for training or common modules attendance.

THE INTERNATIONAL INTERNSHIP EXCHANGE PROGRAMS UNDER ERASMUS+ FRAMEWORK

For internship placements, the Romanian Naval Academy has enclosed over 50 training agreements with specialized companies in Europe, facilitating the internship of more than 150 students annually aboard European flag vessels, to fulfilling their cadetship requirements.


As part of the mobility programs carried out, over 250 ANMB students per year have had access to Englishtaught courses in the naval field (navigation and maritime transport, naval electromechanics and electrical engineering, naval and port logistics), organized by partner universities, or have completed cadetship placements in their field of expertise, implicitly benefiting from the development of transversal competencies in a multicultural and international environment, which enhances their superior integration into the labour market, to the benefit of the economic sector or the Naval Forces.

On the other hand, more than 60 faculty members/experts from the Naval Academy benefit annually from teaching or training mobilities at international partners, and in return, a similar number of incoming faculty members visit the Naval Academy under the Erasmus+ KA1 or KA2 strategic partnerships. From this perspective, the Naval Academy "Mircea cel Bătrân" has an extensive experience in internationalization strategy, continuously pursuing the enhancement of student and faculty mobility through the promotion of the Erasmus+ program for more than 12 years, the Erasmus+ Charter for the 2021-2027 period being awarded the highest score in the most recent evaluation.

Consequently, the Erasmus+ program for international mobility assured for studies, cadetship, and teaching/training stages is systematically complemented by the Naval Academy's involvement in international academic or military training programs conducted with military institutions at the European or international level. Thus, military students regularly participate in joint training modules, specialized internships, or outgoing representation programs in partner military institutions, within the EMILYO (European Initiative for the Exchange of Military Young Officers) framework, inspired by Erasmus+, under the auspices of the European Security and Defence College, primarily materialized in joint harmonized semesters between partners for all services, specialized training modules, training camps, sports competitions, training placements

INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMS AS PHOTOS

From a statistical perspective, the Romanian Naval Academy currently records a high dynamic of military students' mobility, with more than 80 cadets participating yearly in outgoing international mobilities at European partners in a wide portfolio of training modules (i.e. Leadership, Communication, Cybersecurity, Training on Simulators, Common Security and Defence Policy, Meteorology, Seamanship, Robotics, English language, Winter Training, or International weeks), training placements aboard partner training ships, training camps, nautical competitions, or scientific events/seminars. Alternatively, the institutional offer for incoming foreign students has evolved and diversified significantly in recent years, regularly including, in addition to the study semesters within the Erasmus+ program, training modules (i.e. Naval tactics, Navigation training modules, Training on simulators, English terminology, Physical Training, METOC, Seamanship practice modules), training placements aboard the training ship "Mircea", as well as various scientific events for cadets (the annual CadetNav and MasterNav Conferences), attended by students from partner countries: Poland, Ukraine, Bulgaria, Croatia, Latvia, Greece, Turkey, Lithuania, Germany, UK, Portugal, France sau China.

ANMB COORDINATES AS PROJECT LEADERS: THE NAVY-INS-TECH INITIATIVE

Regarding the curricular harmonization at the European level initiated under the aegis of the ESDC – European Security and Defence College, the Romanian Naval Academy was one of the initiating institutions of the Line of Development 11 (LoD11) concerning the implementation of the International Naval Semester, offered to international partners starting with the academic year 2021-2022. Although, Romanian Naval Academy already provides, through its own portal (adl.anmb.ro), a portfolio of over 80 English-taught courses, implemented over the past five years within the Erasmus+ program.

In the same context, the Romanian Naval Academy has been involved in cooperation efforts within the Lines of Development LoD7 (international projects) and LoD14 (scientific research), as well as in the European effort to harmonize the military curriculum, by being part of the SQF-MILF (Sectorial Qualification Framework for the Military Sector) working group in the field of Naval Forces qualifications. Additionally, the Academy annually organizes the international course "Challenges for Maritime Security", under the aegis of the European Security and Defence College (ESDC), attended by participants from the European Union at the senior management level, as well as guest lecturers from partner academies, NATO experts, or representatives of European institutions.

Starting from 2023, the Romanian Naval Academy is implementing, as a leading institution, the international project "NAVY-INS-Tech: International Naval Semester Development Applying the Intelligent Technologies and the Innovative Tools in the European Navy Defense System" (2023-1-RO01-KA220-HED-11F8131F), funded through the Erasmus+ program, KA220 strategic partnerships in higher education, alongside partner naval academies from Italy, Poland, and Bulgaria, during the 2023-2025 implementation period, related to the EMILYO framework harmonization. The project aims to develop a common curriculum in Navy Higher Education Institutions by developing 12 harmonized courses within the consortium, with the major aim to facilitate the implementation of a modular joint semester in European military naval education.

TRAINING SHIP "MIRCEA" TS: THE HONORARY AMBASSADOR OF ROMANIA

A special place in the international activities and actions of the Naval Academy is held by the Training Ship "Mircea", an honorary ambassador of Romania on the waters and oceans of the world, with significant regional and international relevance. Through the organization of international training voyages, it consistently and valuably contributes to promoting the image of the Naval Forces training programs regionally and internationally, within the network of ANMB's partners. Over 20 cadets regularly participate during each year in training voyages for summer training at sea, aboard the Training Ship "Mircea" together with Romanian students, the example of the past joint voyages organized in 2017 and 2018 in partnership with the German Naval Academy being particularly noteworthy (i.e. during these voyages, over 300 German students trained alongside the Romanian Naval Academy's personnel).

It is also worthy to notice that the Training Ship "Mircea" TS plays a major role in international affairs activities, taking part during the summer voyages to diverse visits and events organized by the partner naval academies from Turkey, Greece, Bulgaria, France, Spain, Portugal, Italy, UK, US, Netherlands, and Poland. These visits stimulate the training programs exchanges aboard Navy ships and foster multicultural interactions between Romanian cadets and their European and Trans-Atlantic partners.

INTERNATIONAL PROTOCOL ACTIVITIES

→ In addition to these educational and training activities, a diverse range of international protocolar actions has been systematically planned through the International Relations Plan or through the Bilateral Cooperation Plan. Over the years, Romanian Naval Academy has welcomed numerous visits from foreign ships carrying cadets on board (approximately 400 visiting students per year from partner academies in Greece, Turkey, and Ukraine) as well as official visits from representatives of international partners. By reciprocity, Romanian Naval Academy has conducted institutional-level working and representation visits at the invitation of its counterparts in similar academies in France, Germany, Portugal, Spain, Italy, Greece, Bulgaria, Turkey, Latvia, Norway, Lithuania and Poland.

→ Last but not least, to enhance international cooperation relations, the Naval Academy promotes and actively participates in the implementation of research and development projects funded by European funds alongside its traditional partners. These projects facilitate numerous international activities that directly benefit both students and faculty members/specialists within the academic community, contributing to the exchange of best practices and the modernization of the Naval Academy's educational and research facilities.

In the last years, in addition to the Erasmus+ academic mobility program, the Romanian Naval Academy has intensively accessed available European funds for research, development, and innovation, participating in the implementation of a significant number of international projects alongside various academic and economic partners.

Currently, the Naval Academy reaffirms its role as a catalyst for applied knowledge through projects and programs initiatives. In addition to its portfolio of research and innovation projects, in the past 5 years and in the present, Romanian Naval Academy has been actively involved in 14 international strategic development projects in partnership with institutions from both Romania and abroad, as leading institution of partner, attracting a total of over 2,500,000 EUR in non-refundable European funds, along with additional funds exceeding 800,000 EUR financed through the Erasmus+ academic mobility program.
