The evaluation teams

Based on the institution's priorities and profile, an appropriate team will be formed of up to five members who will visit the institution twice. The IEP expert pool:

- is composed of current and former rectors and vice-rectors, student members and senior higher education experts from all across Europe
- offers a diversity of expertise and university cultures
- applies the concept of peer-review when visiting the institution.

The follow-up procedure

• Possibility to register for a follow-up evaluation, within two to four years of the initial evaluation. Since a team will already be familiar with the institution, this procedure can be more customised than the initial evaluation.

An indicative evaluation cycle

April – June	Annual registration period
September	Notification of the institutions registred for the upcoming round
October	Preparatory workshop for institutions
October – February	Self-evaluation process Compilation of self-evaluation report
February – March	1 st visit of the evaluation team
March – June	2 nd visit Compilation of the report

THE INSTITUTIONAL **EVALUATION PROGRAMME**

The Institutional Evaluation Programme (IEP) is an independent service of the European University Association. Since 1994, IEP has evaluated over 200 higher education institutions across 44 countries worldwide.

IEP evaluates higher education institutions in the context of their own goals and objectives and actively supports them in fulfilling their mission. Recommendations are provided on the institutions' structures, processes, policies and culture, to enable them to perform the full range of their activities and build the capacity to address change processes. IEP evaluation is a voluntary process for the participating institutions; it is independent from governments and other such bodies. It does not lead to accreditation or any other kind of summative judgement.

By signing up for an evaluation, institutions will benefit from:

- An evaluation procedure based on their **institutional profile** and geared towards improving their capacity to implement strategic goals
- A truly European focus taking into account the framework of ongoing reforms in higher education across the continent
- A self-evaluation process that will contribute to increased awareness across the university of the need to develop an internal quality culture and complement external accountability exercises
- Two site visits of an evaluation panel, composed of current or former European rectors or vice-rectors, a student and a senior higher education expert
- A final report that highlights good practices identified and includes recommendations for improvement

- devising appropriate instruments for implementing the mission
- identifying strategic partners who can contribute to meeting objectives

The evaluation teams will provide recommendations for:

- optimising the balance of power between the central leadership and the university's constituencies
- rationalising and balancing the decision-making processes and structures
- clarifying responsibilities and accountability
- balancing the broad engagement of the university community in the preparation and implementation of policies
